
<u>Safety</u>



Attendance Fact


We currently have 187 pupils with 100% attendance since the start of this school year, well done, this is amazing, keep it up!

If we do not receive communication regarding a child's absence it will be recorded in the register as an unauthorised absence. 5 unauthorised register marks can result in a penalty notice being issued by the local authority.
