Key Stage 2 Lunchtimes

We are aware that some parents/carers have expressed concern about the key stage 2 children not going outside every lunchtime. This has been implemented due to the restrictions that we have had to put in place for Covid 19 and to minimise bubble contact. It is not possible to stagger the children being outside during lunchtime. They do go outside at lunchtime on a rota basis, so each year group gets at least one day outside. To compensate for the time the children are missing being outside, we have timetabled a forest school session once a week, the children have one of their P.E lessons outside (weather permitting), staff are also taking children outside at other times during the day to complement their learning. If you have any concerns or questions regarding this please contact school. Primarily our main aim is to keep everyone safe.

One Way System
