Easy Fundraising



Updated Government Guidelines

As you are aware we are asking all parents/carers who are on the school grounds to wear a face mask. We are aware this is not a legal requirement but it is helping to keep our school safe in these very worrying times, so please do wear one unless you are exempt. We have also asked staff to wear face masks in communal areas around school.

One Way System

Thank you for your co-operation with the one-way system around the school grounds. Just a quick reminder that you do not have to leave the school grounds via the gate you entered through, as long as you continue to follow the one-way system you can exit the school grounds through any gate. It is important that we do not have parents/carers congregating at the school gates and that we limit the number of interactions across bubbles. Can you also please ensure that only 1 parent/adult drop off and collect to help minimise the number of adults on site.



ClassCharts

As we build on our capacity to deliver remote learning we have signed up to ClassCharts. Initially we will be using ClassCharts to set homework. Over the next few weeks teaching staff will set homework via ClassCharts. Class 3P have already trialled using this platform and the feedback has been very positive. We are aware that for a number of you, the ability to give your child access to a device is proving difficult and we are working with the Department of Education and the Local Authority to get support in this.



Reporting Absence

Due to the current situation it is very important that you inform us if your child is going to be absent from school. Please inform the school on the first day of absence. Please also provide plenty of detail regarding their illness, this will ensure we follow the correct procedure.
